The main section of the book is then divided into three parts: college resource Web sites, college association Web sites, and counselor associations on the Internet. There are two separate indexes that organize resources in the book by either career title or by Web site title. A glossary of useful terms and a list of common financial aid abbreviations and their meanings are also included—especially useful for students and parents facing the bewildering maze of financial aid applications for the first time.

This book is invaluable and should be in every guidance counselor's office. Although some information will eventually be dated because of the speed at which it changes on the Internet, many Web sites are well established and will continue to provide valuable information to students beginning their college search. **This book is highly recommended for all libraries.**"
